



This Month's Featured Technology: National Primary Plus

The Law Library has added a new collection to Lexis Advance. This collection, entitled National Primary Plus, includes all Federal Primary Law. To search, simply click on the Lexis Advance logo on the desktop. Follow the sign in instructions, then search for the item you need. Type



in "United States Code" or "Code of Federal Regulations." Documents can be printed for \$0.10 a page. Documents can also be emailed or downloaded. For a demonstration, take an Express Class, call the Library at 281-341-3718.

Local Cases

- Powell, Gerald, No. PD-1441-16, (March 22, 2017): PDR refused. (400th Dist.)
- Mandala v. PNC Bank, No. 14-15-01079-CV, (March 23, 2017): dismissed. (434th Dist.)
- Pegues v. State, No. 01-16-00317-CR, (March 28, 2017): rev'd TC judgment and remand to TC. (434th Dist.)
- <u>Ifiesimama v. Haile</u>, No. 01-15-00829-CV, (March 30, 2017): modfy TC judgment and aff'd TC judgment as modified. (400th Dist.)
- Young v. Parent, No. 01-16-00499-CV, (March 30, 2017): aff'd TC judgment in part, rev'd TC judgment in part, and remand to TC. (400th Dist.)
- <u>Jaiyeoba v. Country Title</u>, No. 16-0589, (March 31, 2017): rehearing denied. (268th Dist.)
- Ex Parte Rogers, No. 01-17-00032-CR, (April 4, 2017): appeal dismissed. (268th Dist.)
- <u>Matthias v. Gilbert</u>, No. 14-16-00640-CV, (April 4, 2017): dismissed. (400th Dist.)
- Morrison, Antonnyer, No. PD-1395-16, (April 5, 2017): State's PDR refused. (240th Dist.)

Family Law

• Kramer v. Kastleman, 508 S.W.3d 211 (Tex. 2017): it was held that the acceptance-of-benefits doctrine does not prevent challenging the divorce decree on appeal.

Criminal Law

- Cary v. State, 507 S.W.3d 750 (Tex. Crim. App. 2016): it was held that it was not bribery when defendant supported a candidate to run against the sitting Judge.
- Rivera v. State, 507 S.W.3d 844 (Tex. App.—Houston [1st Dist.] 2016): it was determined that the evidence did not support that the defendant engaged in illegal horse racing while not having a race track license.
- Pena v. State, 508 S.W.3d 599 (Tex. App.—El Paso 2016): the trial court abused its discretion when it took away probation based upon the defendant's "invocation of his privilege against self-incrimination."

Estate Planning and Probate

• In Matter of Guardianship of Virgil, 508 S.W.3d 591 (Tex. App.—El Paso 2016): the ordering of the warranty deed null and void, because it was determined that the grantor was not able to convey property, was not abuse of discretion.
