It is an update to the previous book from the State Bar entitled A Road Map to Guardianship Alternatives. This book provides the legislative updates prior to the 2017 session. The forms in the back of the book are formatted exactly like any other form manuals or books provided by the State Bar. 

Texas Case Law Update

Local Cases

- <u>Crotts v. State</u>, No. 01-15-01108-CR (July 18, 2017): aff'd TC judgment. (CCL # 3)
- In the Matter of Marriage of Adamski, No. 14-16-00099-CV (July 25, 2017): aff'd. (328th Dist.)
- Pate, Megan, No. PD-0412-17 (July 26, 2017): review refused. (CCL # 2)
- Rodriguez v. State, No. 01-14-00774-CR (July 27, 2017): aff'd TC judgment. (240th Dist.)
- IFS2I Consulting vs. Goldvein, S.A., No. 14-15-00407-CV (July 27, 2017): dismissed. (240th Dist.)
- <u>Diogu v. McCloud</u>, No. 14-16-00324-CV (July 27, 2017): dismissed. (400th Dist.)
- Estrella v. State, No. 01-17-00135-CR (August 3, 2017): appeal dismissed. (240th Dist.)
- Compton v. Jue, No. 01-16-00412-CV (August 8, 2017): aff'd TC judgment (268th Dist.)
- Michalac v. State, No. 01-15-00721-CR (August 8, 2017): aff'd TC judgment (CCL # 2)
- Williams v. Chan, No. 14-17-00592-CV (August 8, 2017): dismissed. (CCL #3)

Family Law

- Ex Parte Arango, 518 S.W.3d 916 (Tex. App.—Houston [1st Dist.] 2017): it was determined that the pretrial writ of habeas corpus was warranted since it was found the transfer order from juvenile court to criminal district court was invalid.
- Matter of A.A.R., 518 S.W.3d 645 (Tex. App.—El Paso 2017): the trial court did not abuse its discretion when it denied the juvenile's motion to withdraw plea since the plea was given intelligently, knowingly, and voluntarily.

Criminal Law

- State v. Arizmendi, 519 S.W.3d 143 (Tex. Crim. App. 2017): since the defendant pled guilty before the co-defendant's motion to suppress was granted the defendant's motion for new trial was denied based on the new evidence.
- Davis v. State, 519 S.W.3d 251 (Tex. App.—Houston [1st Dist.] 2017): the defendant's juvenile adjudication could be used to enhance sentence for aggravated assault.

Labor and Employment—Unemployment Compensation

• Harris County v. Workforce Commission, 519 S.W.3d 113 (Tex. 2017): since the members of the county appraisal review board were employed by the county appraisal district therefore are under the unemployment compensation act.
