

This Month's Featured Technology: Legal Databases through Fort Bend County Libraries



The Law Library has access to two databases that you can access from home. Those are *Gale Legal Forms Library* and *Legal Information Reference Center*. *Gale Legal Forms Library* has many commonly used Texas legal forms in Word format that you can download. *Legal Information Reference Center* has useful full-text legal reference books in ebook format. All you need is a Fort Bend County Library Card which you can pick up from any local branch. Please fill out an application, and provide a proof of address and photo ID. Texas Case Law Update

Local Cases

- <u>Human Biostar Inc. v Celltex Therapeutics Corp.</u>, No. 14-15-00234-CV, (January 19, 2017): aff'd. (434th Dist.)
- Santibanez v Diron, No. 01-16-00231-CV, (January 24, 2017): aff'd TC Judgment. (434th Dist.)
- Henriquez v State, No. 14-15-00477-CR, (January 24, 2017): aff'd as reformed. (268th Dist.)
- <u>Builders First Source—South Texas, LP v Ortiz</u>, No. 14-16-00256-CV, (January 26, 2017): aff'd in part, rev'd in part, and remanded in part. (400th Dist.)
- Brady vs. Klentzman, No. 15-0056, (January 27, 2017): aff'd COA Judgment. (240th Dist.)
- Nassar v. Liberty Mutual Fire Insurance, No. 15-0978, (January 27, 2017): COA judgment rev'd; remanded to TC. (400th Dist.)
- Booth v. Kondaur Capital Corp., No. 01-16-00188-CV, (February 2, 2017): aff'd TC Judgment. (CCL # 1)
- Oakbend Medical Center v Martinez, No. 14-16-00199-CV, (February 14, 2017): rev'd and rendered. (268th Dist.)

Family Law

- Marriage of Mobley, 503 S.W.3d 636 (Tex. App.—Texarkana 2016): since the company in this case was husband's separate property and the supposed sham transaction did not give wife entitlement to set aside decree.
- In the Interest of H.G-J, 503 S.W.3d 679 (Tex. App.—Houston [14th Dist.] 2016): the trial court did not have discretion to order the Office of the Attorney General to give child support payments to amicus attorney.

Criminal Law

- Payne v. State, 502 S.W.3d 829, (Tex. App.—Houston [14th Dist.] 2016): it was determined that the evidence showed that the defendant acted on purpose and is enough to support the murder charge.
- Morrison v. State, 503 S.W3d 724 (Tex. App.—Houston [14th Dist.] 2016): the district court lacked jurisdiction to try the defendant who was 16 years old at the time of the offense.

Legal Services

• Sheetz v. Slaughter, 503 S.W.3d 495 (Tex. App.—Dallas 2016): it was found that there was not enough evidence to support the non-attorney was engaged in unauthorized practice of law at the discretion of the attorney.
