FBC Bar News



The book includes over 2,500 annotations and case citations, a table of authorities, and a full index for easy searching and understanding the elements of the law. This book also has twenty-five sample forms so that you can begin you litigation on the right track. Now in its third edition, this title includes updates from the 2015 Legislative Session. Texas Case Law Update

Local Cases

- Gonzales v. State, No. 14-16-00337-CR. (June 22, 2017): aff'd. (268th Dist.)
- Chesloff v. Yeh, No. 16-0217, (June 23, 2017): review denied. (268th Dist.)
- Harrison v. State, No. 01-17-00071-CV, (June 27, 2017): appeal dismissed. (434th Dist.)
- Triafigura Pte. Ltd. v. CNA Metals, No. 14-16-00530-CV. (June 27, 2017): rev'd and remanded. (434th Dist.)
- <u>Chife v. Van Duren</u>, No. 01-17-00100-CV, (June 29, 2017): appeal dismissed. (268th Dist.)
- Galbraith v. Williams Companies, No. 01-15-01084-CV, (July 6, 2017): appeal dismissed. (268th Dist.)
- Rosenberg Development Corp. v. Imperial Performing Arts, No. 14-16-00978-CV, (July 6, 2017): aff'd. (434th Dist.)
- <u>Human Biostar v. Celltex Therapeutics</u>, No. 17-0289, (July 7, 2017): review denied. (434th Dist.)

Family Law

- Hudson v. Aceves, 516 S.W.3d 529 (Tex. App.—Corpus Christi 2016): since the order was in place that precluded husband from seeking any order against wife while she is in Mexico did warrant mandamus relief.
- In Interest of J.I.M, 516 S.W.3d 674 (Tex. App.—Texarkana 2017): the County Court at Law did not have jurisdiction and therefore could not enter an order terminating the mother's parental rights.

Criminal Law

- Hartfield v. State, 516 S.W.3d 57 (Tex. App.—Corpus Christi 2017): since it had been a delay of 30 years from the conviction and sentence were vacated to the time of the hearing on the motion to dismiss for speedy trial, it was found that the state had violated the defendants right to a speedy trial.
- Gutierrez v. State, 516 S.W.3d 593 (Tex. App.—Houston [1st Dist.] 2017): defendant's rights under the Confrontation Clause were violated when the testimonial hearsay statements were admitted.
- Hayes v. State, 516 S.W3d. 649 (Tex. App.—Houston [1st Dist.] 2017): it was determined to not be harmful error when defendant was excluded from co-defendant's presentence investigation hearing.

Government—Elections

• City of Houston v. Bryant (Tex. App.—Houston [1st Dist.] 2017): the statute that governs return of unserved citations in election contests was not jurisdictional, it did not prohibit the reissuance of the citation.
