## FBC Bar News



# This Month's Featured Technology: Importing a PDF into Lexis for Microsoft Word

Importing a PDF into Microsoft Word is easy. Simply click on the Microsoft Word icon on the desktop which is located in the upper right corner of the screen. Then select the Lexis Nexis

tab on the ribbon at the top. Then select the "Import PDF" icon to the right of the center of the tab. It will open a dialog box. Simply find the appropriate PDF you wish to import either from the computer, a flash drive, or a download from Lexis Advance. Once clicked, it will automatically import and



convert the PDF into Word for easy editing. This can be done with any type of PDF including forms, briefs, letters, or any other type of documents. This feature is available on computers 1 & 2 at the Law Library. Need a demonstration? Contact the Law Library at 281-341-3718 and take an Express Class!

# Texas Case Law Update

#### **Local Cases**

- <u>Lawton v. Lawton</u>, No. 16-0124, (February 17, 2017): petition for review denied. (CCL 1)
- <u>First Colony Community Services Assoc. v. Valentz</u>, No. 01-16-00060-CV, (February 23, 2017): Rev'd TC judgment and remand to TC. (268th Dist.)
- Arceneaux v. Pinnacle Entertainment, No. 14-15-00894-CV, (February 23, 2017): aff'd (268th Dist.)
- De Los Santos v. Estate of Kidder, No. 14-16-00782-CV, (February 23, 2017): dismissed (CCL #4)
- Cox v. State, No. 14-15-00684-CR, (February 23, 2017): aff'd (434th Dist.)
- Tran v. Tran, No. 01-16-00248-CV, (March 2, 2017): aff'd TC judgment. (400th Dist.)
- Kroger v. Bamonte, No. 14-16-00896-CV, (March 2, 2017): dismissed. (400th Dist.)
- Rodriguez v. State, No. 01-14-00774-CR, (March 7, 2017): aff'd TC judgment (240th Dist.)
- Reagins v. Walker, No. 14-15-00764-CV, (March 7, 2017): aff'd in part, rev'd in part, remand in part. (387th Dist.)
- Bonner v. State, No. 01-15-01093-CR, (March 9, 2017): aff'd TC judgment (434th Dist.)

#### Family Law

• C.S.F. v. Texas Dept. of Family Services, 505 S.W.3d 618 (Tex. 2016): it was held that the a pro se indigent parent has the right to appointed counsel in pursuing a petition for review in the Supreme Court.

#### Criminal Law

- Guthie-Nail v. State, 506 S.W.3d 1 (Tex. Crim. App. 2015): since judgment nunc pro tunc to make deadly weapon finding was made without notice to defendant, which violated due process, warranted the remand.
- Newkirk v. State, 506 S.W.3d 188 (Tex. App.—Texarkana 2016): it was found that the defendant was not prejudiced due to trial counsel's inability to request a sudden passion instruction during the punishment phase.
- Ex Parte Davis, 506 S.W.3d 150 (Tex. App.—Tyler 2016): even though due to the allegations applicant's insurance raced increased and standing in the community decreased it does not entitle applicant to habeas relief.

#### **Real Property**

• Crosstex North v. Gardiner, 505 S.W.3d 580 (Tex. 2016): the term "nuisance" did not refer to the act or damages, but only applied to the legal injury when "determining the interference of plantiff's use and enjoyment of property."
