



This Month's Featured Technology: Erisman's Reversible Error's in Texas Criminal Courts



This title from Knowles Publishing, now on CD, examines criminal law where reverses have occurred. It is available on all six computers in the Law Library. Focusing on Texas Criminal Courts, the chapters focus on topic areas such as arrest, search and seizure, photographs, hearsay, and judgment and sentence. The chapters state the point of error and include relevant codes and cases. The new edition includes information on plea bargaining, accomplice testimony, and frivolous appeals. ### Texas Case Law Update

#### **Local Cases**

- Sam, Lorenza Andre, No. PD-1319-16, (April 26, 2017): discretionary review refused. (240th Dist.)
- McGregor, Edward George, WR-85,833-01, (April 26, 2017): habeas corpus remanded to TC. (434th Dist.)
- Nehls vs. Hartman Newspapers, No. 01-16-00121-CV, (April 27, 2017): rev'd TC judgment and render judgment. (240th Dist.)
- In the Matter of Marriage of Lobe, No. 14-17-00092-CV, (April 27, 2017) dismissed. (505th Dist.)
- Paloba v. CACH, LLC., No. 14-16-00984-CV, (May 4, 2017): dismissed. (CCL # 5)
- Onwuchuruba v. Onwuchuruba, No. 01-16-00471-CV, (May 9, 2017): appeal dismissed. (387th Dist.)
- Memorial Hermann v. Turner, No. 14-17-00232-CV, (May 9, 2017): dismissed. (240th Dist.)
- Ex Parte Moy, No. 14-16-00420-CR, (May 9, 2017): aff'd. (268th Dist.)

#### Family Law

- R.M. v. Swearingen, 510 S.W.3d 630 (Tex. App.—El Paso 2016): it was determined that the person who filed the protective order on family violence or sexual assault is the only person who could rescind order before expiration.
- Curley v. Curley, 511 S.W.3d 131 (Tex. App.—El Paso 2014): since the husband did not fully perform a search to find wife before filing a service by publication the trial court did not have personal jurisdiction over wife.

#### **Criminal Law**

- Timmons v. State, 510 S.W.3d 713 (Tex. App.—El Paso 2016): after being determined to be incompetent to stand trial and receiving treatment, defendant did not have the right to a hearing to redetermine whether she was competent to stand trial while charges were pending.
- Byram v. State, 510 S.W.3d 918 (Tex. Crim. App. 2017): it was held that police officer was performing community–caretaking responsibility when he pulled over a car whose passenger was not moving.
- State v. \$90,235,000, 511 S.W.3d 136 (Tex. App.—El Paso 2014): defendant whose forfeiture of cash found in car during investigatory stop was determined to not be unreasonable.

#### Real Property—Mineral Rights and Interests

• Bank of America v. Prize Energy Resources, 510 S.W.3d 497 (Tex. App.—San Antonio): though it was found that there was alleged fraud, the decision to continue with oil and gas lease was not a waiver of fraud.
