Featured Resource: Texas Sentencing 6th Edition

The Fort Bend County Law Library is working on expanding it's criminal section to make sure we are not missing any area that you may need. To that end, we have bought a treatise on Texas Sentencing from Juris Publishing. This title, in it's Sixth Edition, covers sentencing in Texas Criminal Law focusing on the Code of Criminal Procedure and the Penal Code. This annotated treatise covers all aspects of sentencing in a easy and concise book. Breaking it down by charge in the first chapter it covers punishment ranges. The next chapter discusses the sentencing procedure from pretrial to judgment. Chapters 3 thru 5 discuss post trial



remedies and consequences including community supervision, early release and collateral consequences. The final chapter has forms including pretrial motions, enhancements, jury instructions, and proposed orders for those needing them. The book is written by John Bradley who has been a prosecutor since 1987 and is currently the District Attorney for Williamson County where he has been serving since 2001. He has been involved in helping the State Legislature rewrite the Penal Code and has been a member of the Punishment Standards Commission. Copies of this book can be made for \$0.10 a page. This Month's Featured Technology: FBCLL's Basic Office Essentials

The Law Library has been re-opened in its new location in Room 20716 on the 2nd Floor of the Justice Center for just over a month. We are glad to be getting back up to full operation and offering as many basic technological and office services to our patrons. Attorneys and pro se patrons will find that the library offers basic and essential services to allow them to work on their cases and legal matters while away from their offices and homes. We have seven computers that provide many services: access to several legal research and form databases; internet access to check e-mail, E-file documents, look up case information on the County's website, etc.; word processing ability with Word, Word Perfect, Excel, Adobe, etc.; the ability to watch incident/arrest videos with headphones; and much more. We anticipate adding three more patron computers this Fall. There are black and white and color printers. The Law Library is equipped with a fax machine. There are two black and white copiers that also have scanners. And we provide staplers, paperclips, tape, and hole punches. Printing is 10¢ per page for black and white, \$1 per page for color; copying is 10¢ per page; incoming and outgoing local faxes are \$1 per page (1-800 numbers are considered local), \$2 per page for long distance; and scanning is free. Cash or check only please. We now have two small meeting rooms available on a first come first served basis, an AV room for watching Court-required CLE, and a conference room is available by reservation only. We have doubled our table space (we now have four 4-person tables) to allow patrons space to study, fill out paperwork, etc. We even have a couple of easy chairs if you just need to come in and take a break and read the newspaper. We have been provided with a great new Law Library and we are eager and proud to serve you. For more information, please contact the Law Library.

Environmental Law

• City of Laredo v. Laredo Merchants Association, 550 S.W.3d 586 (Tex. 2018): "Paper or Plastic?" Laredo wanted to make that question a thing of the past by passing an ordinance prohibiting merchants from providing "single use" paper or plastic bag to customers in the interest of alleviating litter and solid waste issues. Ordinance was upheld at trial. Court of Appeals reversed holding that the ordinance conflicted with the Texas Solid Waste Disposal Act which provides that a local government may adopt an ordinance in this regard if it is not authorized by State law. The Supreme Court, looking to the Legislature that passed the Act, found that its clearly written limitation on local control prohibits such an ordinance. Opinion of the Court of Appeals affirmed. Thus, using five plastic bags for five items at the grocery store express lane is still legal.

Family Law

• In the Interest of H.S., a Minor Child, 550 S.W.3d 151 (Tex. 2018): Mother and biological father challenged the standing of her parents (the child's grandparents) to bring a Suit Affecting Parent-Child Relationship (SAPCR) seeking to be appointed as managing conservators with the exclusive right to designate their grandchild's residence. Grandparents claimed standing under Family Code § 102.003(a)(9) as non-parents who had had six months or more of actual care, control, and possession of the child while mother was in alcohol rehab and father had the child every other weekend. Mother and father had intended for the arrangement to be temporary. Supreme Court found that grandparents had standing and remanded case to district court for determination on the merits.
